The Auxiliary to the City Board of Education submits the following report of efforts made and work done during the past year:

The Board has not attempted to do very much during the past year which required much financing. However the Board did help defray the expenses of operating the High School Library, assisted in operating a Vocational Class at the East Side School for women and other smaller matters.

During the year the Board attempted to help make the sanitary conditions about the school better. They feel that in some respects they are not as they should be. The Board had hoped that something might be done during the past year to provide better facilities for the number of children who have been found mentally defective and not capable of carrying on work with the average child.

The Board was interested in bettering conditions at the Negro school and the efforts of the Board did encourage the negroes to help themselves and get help elsewhere. It is felt that the present Principal of the Negro School is not the best one, should have

The members of the Board made a number of personal visits to the school and we believe probably this was the most effective part of our work, keeping in touch with teachers and their work.

The District High School Meet was held here during the term and the Board was glad to help Mr. Evans and the teachers with the meet which was a success and meant much to the town.

Two P. T. A.'s were organized during which the Board assisted.

There were so many small things done which were to the interest of the school. In all we feel it was a good year.

With the above report of the year's work me, the Auxiliary Board beg to submit the following recommendations:

1. That the toilet situation at the negro school be made what it should be for the morals of those influenced.
2. That a more suitable Principal for

the Negro School be secured.

3. That a janitress be employed to assist the janitor on the West Side especially in the care of the girls' toilets.

4. That a place be provided for the washing of hands during the school day.

5. That sufficient garbage cans be provided to keep the grounds cleared of waste.

6. That some provision be made for the children in school who are not mentally able to carry on work with the average class. By inspection at least fifteen such children have been found and they not only do not progress themselves but are a hindrance to others.

7. That some provision be made for the care of the High School Library. A very good library has been built up in the school but no funds for keeping the same open for use.

8. That the Part Time Vocational Classes for women be carried on in some manner by the school or some organization.

After some discussion with reference to the principal of the colored schools it was decided that Mr. W. E. Dendy, Superintendent, call on Prof. Young for his resignation.

TEACHER'S CONTRACT

For Teachers of Vocational Agriculture

Employed in co-operation with Georgia State Board For
Vocational Education

This is to certify that the Board of Education of Carterville, Ga.
has entered into a contract with J.S. Morgan to teach
Vocational Agriculture in the Carterville (colored) school.
The salary of said J.S. Morgan to be \$90 per
month from Sept. 1, 1925 to Sept. 1, 1926 and is to be paid
monthly by the said board as follows: \$90 cash,
and no perquisite.

The said teacher of Vocational Agriculture shall give part of
his time to the teaching of agriculture according to the plan
set forth by the Georgia State board for Vocational Education, and
he shall supervise the practical work of the pupils whom he is
instructing. In addition to the regular teaching set forth above
the teacher shall be expected to be Principal of school and teach
literary work about half of his time.

Present: O.W.Haney, W.B.Perry, Ben C.Gilreath, H.B.Rebertson.

On motion and second it was decided to open the Spring Term Monday, Jan. 3rd.

On motion and second it was carried that the Board of Education recommend that the City of Cartersville build shop for negroes according to specifications submitted by Walter B.Hill, who proposes to pay \$600, of the cost of same, and also J.S.Morgan proposes to raise and pay \$150. of the cost of same.

Moved and seconded and carried that High School Students be required to pay a Library fee of one dollar (\$1.) per year. ~~#####~~ Fifty cents (.50c) payable ~~for~~ September and fifty cents (.50c) payable January. Said fee to be collected as part of regular tuition for these two months.
